SCC Funeral Ceremony

The funeral ceremony will probably be the most frequently requested official ceremony. When preparing the ceremony, bear in mind that non-Spiritualists will also be attending and try to make their first impressions positive.

The request for a funeral ceremony may come from:

- The funeral director (who will give the minister the details known to him)
- A relative of the deceased (who will give the minister the name and telephone number of the funeral director so they can liaise regarding the arrangements). It is the family's responsibility to appoint and instruct the funeral director but the family will often ask the minister for advice and guidance.
- The church concerned (who will likely be able to provide the name and telephone number of next of kin)

The minister will contact and meet with the next of kin to:

- Obtain name and telephone number of the Funeral Home.
- Obtain full legal name of the deceased, and the name used by the family
- Age of the deceased, date of death
- Discuss the type of ceremony (cremation or burial)
- Ask where the ceremony will be held in a church, at the Crematorium
- Ask about the layout of the church or other location, seating available, whether an organist is available, whether hymnbooks are available, what help will be available and get the name of the person in charge of the day's activities, ask if there is a time limit for the service, etc
- Discuss arrangements with the family regarding special requests, their choice of hymns and readings
- Get the deceased's life history, occupation, special interests, hobbies, social activities, church involvement, surviving family and their names, etc so the ceremony can be personalized

The minister and those taking an active part in the day need to arrive early to ensure that all is in order and to greet those arriving.

The minister stands at the entrance to the church or crematorium to meet and lead the funeral procession into the church/crematorium, standing to one side facing the coffin until the pallbearers have left.

When the ceremony is concluded:

Church - the coffin must be led out. While it is being placed in the hearse the minister will speak briefly to the family.

Crematorium - minister stands at the exit to shake each mourner's hand as they leave.

In the case of a burial, the coffin should be led to the burial plot, the minister standing at the head of the coffin for the service of committal. Instead of dropping earth onto the coffin, a flower could be substituted. After the committal the minister shakes hands with the immediate family then stands to one side to allow the family a few moments alone.

The minister may be asked back to the home. Acceptance of this invitation is a personal choice and his/her role would be to offer discreet support.

The funeral director will also wish to know the amount of fee - this is the non-conformist fee. It is entirely up to each individual concerned as to whether or not a fee is accepted and to what use it is put. Whether it is decided to keep or to donate, it must be remembered that if the fee recipient pays income tax then the fee will attract income tax.

On occasion, following a cremation, the minister may be asked to either bury or scatter the ashes - this request is usually made by either the next of kin or the Funeral Director.

The regulations governing this aspect are handled by the funeral director who will advise the time, date and place for the ceremony to take place.

A short ceremony is all that is required as usually only the immediate family will be present and should include a prayer, an appropriate reading and a few words concerning the deceased.

The minister will occasionally be asked to conduct a service for very difficult situations – such as the passing of a child or a suicide. The family is, quite naturally, devastated and angry and are looking not only for support but also for answers as to why such a situation has happened to them.

The service should be carefully worded so that it is uplifting, supportive and gives the family hope. Under no circumstances must it appear to be judgmental.

Following a funeral service a Memorial Service is occasionally required and this is usually held for a Church Member or Platform Worker and the initial approach is normally from the church concerned.

There is no set format for this service and it will depend upon the requirements of the church. Some churches prefer to include this in with their normal type of service while others prefer a separate occasion. In all cases it is necessary to prepare an appropriate address which should include a tribute to the deceased and should contain different aspects from the funeral service tribute to ensure that the families do not have to listen to a repeat of the funeral tribute.

Sample Funeral Ceremony

Read from Rostrum

(or meet the funeral procession (cortege) at the Church door and read slowly while walking to the platform)

Blessed are all who die in the knowledge of God; they rest awhile from labour, and their works follow them.

Though we walk through the valley of the shadow of death, we have no fear; God is with us; His guidance and strength will comfort and sustain us to our journey's end.

We know that Thou art ever directing all things to the fulfillment of Thy purposes, and that Thy Love is manifesting through all the varied experiences of our life.

Grant to us, we pray Thee, that larger vision of Thy Love – that greater understanding of Thy purpose. Help us to realize, in very truth, that death is the gateway of Life.

For those who have been bereaved, we ask that the knowledge of Spiritual verities which Thou hast given them may be a true and shining light in this dark hour. May they realize in very truth that their loss is his (her) gain, and in the realization of this may their sorrow be alleviated.

Knowing that the bonds of affection still unite them, may they not grieve as those without hope, but ever strengthen those bonds by thoughts of love and kindliness.

May the knowledge that _______ is progressing be to each one a stimulus – that the passing years, bringing us all to The Great Adventure, may lift us and him (her) to the fuller realization of our Divine heritage.

Enable us all to make the most of each passing day; to sow those seeds of service and kindliness which will help the establishment of Thy Kingdom on earth, and bring us that harvest of joy which alone can satisfy our soul through eternity.

We give Thee our grateful thanks for all blessings bestowed upon us; for the Light of Truth revealed to us; and for the Ministry of Spirits Thou hast send to help us in our pilgrimage.

To Thee would we render true worship and adoration, in Spirit and in Truth, now and for ever. AMEN

SAMPLE FUNERAL SERVICE

OPENING SENTENCES – to be said slowly, and with pauses between, either on meeting the cortege at the Church or Crematorium entrance and whilst walking to the rostrum/lectern, or from the rostrum/lectern.

Our knowledge of the Great Spirit is a refuge and strength, a very present help in times of trouble.
